World Day of Prayer, sponsored locally by Church Women United is on March 6, 2009. The service will be held at the Camp Hill Presbyterian Church. All are invited.

Elizabeth Winters reported on the preparation for the Lower Susquehanna Synodical Women's Organization of the ELCA Convention being held at Trinity June 26 and 27, 2009. Housing may be needed for those out-of-town attendees. The cost to attend is \$35 for two days and \$25 for a one day registration. Bishop Hoover will be there Friday afternoon for a question and answer session and will be leading a church service on Saturday.
