




HARRISBURG SINGERS: HOLIDAY!

The Singing Sergeants is the official chorus of the United States Air Force. Stationed at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling in Washington, D.C., the group is one of six musical ensembles that comprise The U.S. Air Force Band. Featuring 24 active duty Airmen musicians, the Singing Sergeants presents more than 200 performances annually performing a wide range of musical styles, from traditional Americana, opera, and choral standards to modern Broadway and jazz.

Through disciplined preparation and thoughtful development of their repertoire, The Harrisburg Singers strive to enrich their listeners with experiences they will long remember and look forward to enjoying again. Since 1984, The Harrisburg Singers have become one of Central Pennsylvania's finest choral ensembles, combining the vocal talents of 40 members.

Mark Hayes is an award-winning concert pianist, composer, arranger and conductor. His personal catalog, totaling over 1,000 published works, includes work for solo voice, solo piano, multiple pianos, orchestra, jazz combo, small instrumental ensembles, and choruses of all kinds. Mark received a Bachelor of Music degree summa cum laude in Piano Performance from Baylor University in 1975. He has served as guest conductor at Carnegie Hall, featuring his *Te Deum and Magnificat*. Mark arranged and orchestrated the music for *Civil War Voices*, which won six awards including "Best Musical" in the 2010 Midtown International Theatre Festival in New York. He conducted the world premiere of his work for chorus, orchestra and narrator, *The American Spirit*, at Lincoln Center in May 2011 and the world premiere of his *Requiem* in Lincoln Center in May 2013. The album, *I've Just Seen Jesus*, which Mark arranged, orchestrated and co-produced, received the Dove Award for *Praise and Worship Album of the Year* in 1986. Whether concertizing on the other side of the globe or composing at his home in Kansas City, Missouri, Mark is blessed to live out his mission "to create beautiful music for the world".
