Life at Trinity continues forward. Like the in-person weekend worship, we have begun inperson educational opportunities. The Pastors Thursday Bible Study, lead primarily by Pastor Horner, but ably assisted by Pastor Frey and myself, has started. So, too, has the Men Tuesday Bible Study. Unlike the Thursday Bible study, which meets at Trinity to be streamed later in the day, the Tuesday group is meeting once again at Brothers Family Dining in Mechanicsburg.
