### **MADE TO PLAY**

an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and/or working as a group



Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them. Thank God for the Christmas season and all the joy and celebration it brings. Praise God for being a God who can do anything and still chose to send His one and only Son to be our Savior. Ask God to put these truths on your kids' hearts today.

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### **1. EARLY ARRIVER**

**WHAT YOU NEED:** Offering container and tray of baby items covered with the towel

### WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite kids to place their offerings in the container.
- Uncover the tray and show kids the baby items.
- Encourage them to name each item and talk about how it's used. Provide help as needed.
- Cover the items with the towel and guide kids to close their eyes. No peeking!
- While the kids' eyes are closed, remove and hide one item.
- Invite kids to open their eyes.
- Give them about ten seconds to silently look at the items to determine which one is missing.
- Challenge kids to identify the missing item.
- Repeat as time allows.

### 2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Paper plates and baby blocks

### WHAT YOU DO:

- Help each kid find a partner.
- Give each pair a paper plate and a set of four or five baby blocks.
- At your signal, guide one kid on each team to set the paper plate on top of their head, then vertically stack the blocks on the plate.
- Their partner can cheer them on and guide them verbally but can't provide physical help in any way.
- For kids to win, their blocks must stay stacked for 15 seconds!
- Lead kids to switch roles and play again. Continue as time allows.

### WHAT YOU SAY:

"Did it seem impossible to keep the blocks stacked and win the game? [Transition] In our Bible story today, we'll hear about two people who had something in their life that seemed impossible. Let's go learn more."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

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### **TODAY'S BIBLE STORY**

### \* 1. IMPOSSIBLE?

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

**WHAT YOU NEED:** "Game Board" Activity Pages, "Impossible?" Activity Page cards, Bible marked at Luke 1, and dice

### WHAT YOU DO:

- Open your Bible to Luke 1 and post a set of "Impossible?" cards—in order from left to right—where kids can see them.
- Invite kids to use the cards to help them summarize the Bible story in their own words. Be sure they touch on the points below.
- Ask prompting or guiding questions to help them fill in any "blanks."
  - One year, Zechariah was chosen to enter the temple while the other priests waited outside.
  - An angel appeared and told him that he and Elizabeth would have a son. Zechariah asked how he could be sure. The angel, Gabriel, said that because Zechariah didn't believe his words, he wouldn't be able to speak until after his son, John, was born.
  - The other priests wondered why it was taking Zechariah so long. When Zechariah came out, he couldn't speak. The priests knew that he had seen a special message from God.
  - Zechariah went home, and in a short time Elizabeth found out that she would have a child.
  - Elizabeth gave birth to a son.
  - A few days later, friends and relatives gathered to name him. They wanted to name him Zechariah, but Elizabeth said he must be called John.
  - Zechariah asked for something to write on and wrote "His name is John." Immediately, Zechariah could speak again.
- Help kids get into teams of two or three.
- Give each team a die, a game board, and a set of cards.
- One kid repeatedly rolls the die, attempting to roll a one.
- As soon as they roll a one, they add the first "Impossible?" card to their gameboard.
- The next kid rolls the die until they roll a two. Once successful, they add the second card to their gameboard.
- Play continues until each team successfully rolls one through five.
- The catch: If a player rolls a six, the team must remove the last earned card from their gameboard.
- For example, if a player is attempting to roll a four and rolls a six, the team must remove the third card from their gameboard. They must then attempt to roll a three again.
- Once a team has all its cards, encourage teammates to use the cards to tell each other the Bible story.

#### WHAT YOU SAY:

"Zechariah and Elizabeth were too old to have children. They were as old as GRANDPARENTS! But God can do ANYTHING, and God gave them a son!



### (\*1. IMPOSSIBLE?, CONTINUED)

"God can do anything in your life, too. You may feel like something in your life is impossible. You may feel like you'll never be able to play your instrument, score a goal for your team, learn to tie your shoes, or read as well as your friends. (Adjust your examples based on what you know of your kids.) But no matter how IMPOSSIBLE something feels, God can help you. He is BIG enough and POWERFUL enough to help you in ANY situation. So this week, remember to **celebrate because God can do ANYTHING**."

### 2. CELEBRATE!

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: Supplies for your chosen activities

### WHAT YOU DO:

Host a "Baby Shower" to celebrate because God can

- do anything. Choose one or both of the activities below.
- Make a snack:
  - Guide kids to wash their hands.
  - Give each kid a plastic zipper-top bag.
  - Set out small containers filled with your ingredients.
  - Invite kids to mix the items together to make their own trail mix.
  - Give kids freedom to choose what goes into their trail mix, but encourage them to include a variety of items. You can also limit their portions of candy.
- Play "Baby, Baby, Where's Your Toy?"
  - Guide kids to sit in a circle and hold their hands behind their backs.
  - Choose one kid to stand in the center and be the "baby."
  - Direct the "baby" to close their eyes. When they're closed, silently place a pacifier or other baby item in one child's hand. Step away.
  - Lead the "baby" to open their eyes and guess who has the item.
  - Allow them to guess until they find it.
  - The kid holding the item becomes the new "baby."
  - Add challenge for older kids by allowing them to pass the item behind their backs while the "baby" isn't looking!

### WHAT YOU SAY:

"Sometimes there are things in our lives that seem IMPOSSIBLE. You may feel like you'll never be able to read or someone you love may be really sick or things may be hard at home. But God is BIG enough and POWERFUL enough to help in ANY situation!

[Make It Personal] (Tell kids about a time something in your life seemed impossible. You may have had a conflict with a friend, a sickness, or trouble at home. Tell the group how God showed His love and His power in the situation. Tell them how you celebrated, too!)

"Zechariah and Elizabeth celebrated when God did the impossible by giving them a son. And just like they celebrated, we can **celebrate because God can do anything**, too!"

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### 3. BABY BOTTLE BIBLE VERSE BOWLING

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Memory Verse Cards" Activity Pages taped to bottles; glow sticks; Bibles; and balls

#### WHAT YOU DO:

- Just before starting this activity, activate the glow sticks and drop one or two into each bottle. Screw on the lids.
- Use the Bible navigation tips below to help kids look up and "read" the memory verse.

**Finding verses with kindergartners:** Guide kids to open the Bibles to the marked page. Point to the "John" at the top of the page as you say, "John." Then guide kids to find the big number 3 on the page. Explain that this is the chapter number. Finally, guide them to look under the big 3 for the little 16; this is the verse number. Tell them to leave their finger on the verse as you read the verse aloud. Then lead everyone to say the verse together.

**Finding verses with 1st graders:** Guide kids to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like. When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find John in the list under "New Testament." You can help by telling them that John starts with the letters J-O. When the kids find John, lead them to look at the page number beside the word. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find John. Help the kids find the page. When they find John, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find chapter 3. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find verse 16 in chapter 3.

- Unpack the phrase "God so loved the world," emphasizing that God loved us SO MUCH that He sent His OWN Son to be born on Earth, to live among us and later die on the cross for our sins.
- Divide kids into teams of three or four.
- Instruct teams to line up at one end of your environment.
- Arrange a set of six "Memory Verse Cards" bottles in a triangular pattern (like bowling pins) opposite each team, about ten feet away.
- Give each team a ball. If possible, turn off the lights.
- At your signal, the first kid on each team rolls the ball to knock down as many pins as possible.
- Kids take turns until all of their team's pins are knocked down.
- Once successful, kids crawl like babies to their pins, work together to put the verse in order, and "read" the verse (with help as needed).

#### WHAT YOU SAY:

"John 3:16 tells us that God loved the world SO much that He sent His Son, Jesus. And that's what Christmas is all about! Christmas is celebrating JESUS, God's greatest gift! So remember to **celebrate because God can do anything**."

### 4. PRAY AND DISMISS [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed.

### WHAT YOU DO:

• Use the conversation below as a guide to lead kids in prayer.

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### **BASIC TRUTH**

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### WHAT YOU SAY:

"Zechariah and Elizabeth were too old to have children. They were as old as GRANDPARENTS! But God can do ANYTHING, and God gave them a son! God can do anything in your life, too. He is BIG enough and POWERFUL enough to help you in ANY situation. So this week, remember to **celebrate because God can do ANYTHING**.

"Dear God, I praise You because You can do ANYTHING. You are AMAZING and WONDERFUL and POWERFUL, and we love You SO much. This week, help us remember and CELEBRATE that You can do anything. Amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, encourage kids to tell them today's **celebrate because God can do anything**.

### **1. EARLY ARRIVER**

- Sturdy paper plates—one for each kid
- Cloth or plastic baby blocks—four to five for every two kids
