Trinity encourages electronic giving. Go to [www.trinitycampill.org](http://www.trinitycampill.org), click "donate," then "create profile," and follow the instructions.

If you already give electronically AND if the estimate above is different from the amount you give now, YOU must update the amount by changing your online profile or by completing a paper form. We cannot initiate this change for you.



**Did you give electronically today? If so, put an “I gave electronically” card in the offering plate.** There's nothing to fill out (e-givers already gave us their info when they signed up online). Just drop in the card. Why, you ask? Three good reasons: (1) Using this card helps you avoid feeling awkward when the plate passes you by. (2) You'll show a visible example of stewardship just like your fellow Trinity members who use offering envelopes. (3) Finally, when others notice the card in the plate or the basket, you'll help to publicize the ease of e-giving. The new blue cards are in the pew pockets in the nave and on the back table in Fellowship Hall. Also

on the card is a quick response code that, when scanned with a smart phone, takes you to our e-giving web page.

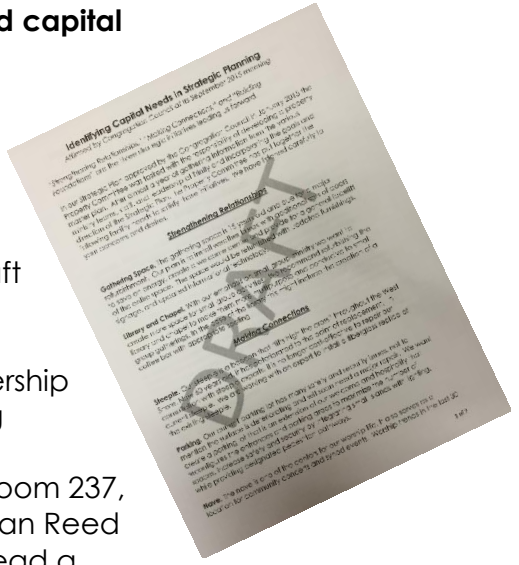
**Michael Donovan is Trinity's Artist of the Month for October.**
