Noon-3 pm – Come/leave as you wish


7 pm – Dramatic service with readings and light

Summary of March 13 Council meeting

- **Steeple Repairs:** The steeple rehab is on track to begin in June. In the meantime, the Property Committee reported finding a leak that required immediate repair.
- **Giving Kiosk:** Approved Stewardship's recommendation to purchase a Vanco Payment Solutions kiosk for \$1,195 (funds from undesignated memorials) for installation in the Gathering Space. The kiosk provides a new and easy giving option.
- **Door Access System:** Approved using \$5,000 from the Tokuhata family bequest and up to \$15,000 from MIRA. By limiting/controlling access during non-worship hours, we can better monitor who enters the building, thereby enhancing security.
- **Discussed interim associate pastor.** Watch for more information.
- **Donation to Soirée for Seminary Scholarships:** Approved \$2,000 (from Church Vocation Loan Fund) for Gettysburg scholarships.
- **New Publicity and Communications Team facilitator:** Approved Danelle Andrews.
- **New Members:** Approved 46 new members.

- ✓ **Fun fact.** Will be married 50 years this fall.


