Relief has been provided for disasters like Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, and Maria, the earthquake in Mexico, and the ongoing conflict in Syria. 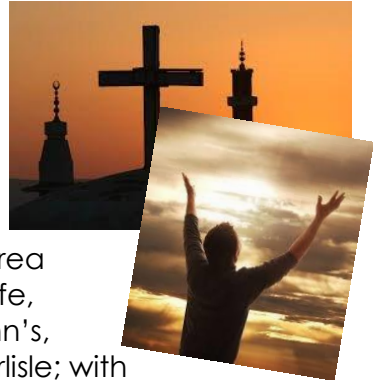
