

Distribution of Holy Communion

We invite all baptized Christians to the Lord's Table to celebrate the real presence of Christ in the Sacrament. The pastors will offer communion at seven stations. You will be directed by the ushers. Communion is by intinction. You will receive a wafer. Dip it in the chalice of wine before consuming. You may then return to your seat. Children and adults who aren't communing may come forward to receive a blessing. As a gesture of hospitality, we use dealcoholized wine (less than .5% alcohol). In addition, we offer gluten-free wafers, available upon request – please ask at the time of communion.
