Formed in 2004, the Prayer Shawl Ministry has been a vital part of Trinity's outreach to those hospitalized, confined to their homes or nursing facilities, and family members who are grieving the loss of loved ones. As of November, 1,256 shawls were made and 1,196 were distributed. Currently there are fourteen members who support this ministry. The group meets the fourth Thursday of each month from 1-3 pm in Room 125. Ideas are shared, shawls completed and handed in, and God is asked to bless the shawls that they may be tangible evidence of the love and prayers of our congregation.
