Trinity's Security Task Force has submitted its report to Congregation Council with recommendations to help increase building security and the safety of our members and guests. The first of these recommendations is to keep **three doors locked at all times: Market Street entrance, the outside kitchen door, and the door at the end of the kitchen hallway.** Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we strive to make Trinity a safe environment for everyone.

March art display. Helen Bender Bigelow (1927-2017) was a self-taught painter and loved creating beautiful works of art from common, ordinary things she found discarded by others. Her creative talents included painting, puppeteering, candlemaking, cake decorating, scrapbooking, and gardening. A Trinity member for 58 years, Helen was a Chancel Choir member, Sunday School

and Bible School teacher, Trinity Tutor, landscape gardener, and more. She also worked for more than 25 years as a Contact Helpline volunteer. She was devoted to her family and is survived by her husband of 69 years, three children, eight grandchildren, fifteen great-grandchildren, and one great-great grandchild. 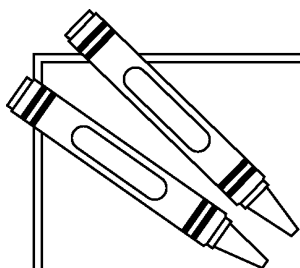
