The sound of silence by Rev. Dr. Jack Horner

*For God alone my soul waits in silence;
from him comes my salvation. (Psalm 62.1)*

Sometimes life is too loud. We wake up to the alarm or to a baby's cry, a child's voice, chirping birds, or a dog's flapping ears. Our day is filled with other noises; radio, TV, the ding of a message, the ring of a telephone ring, sounds of traffic, roar of a lawnmower, hum of machines, conversations in the hall.

Noise is part of our modern human existence.

A recent report on noise pollution concluded, "There is overwhelming evidence that exposure to environmental noise has adverse effects on the health of the population." (World Health Organization and the European Commission's Joint Research Centre.) It's not just the damage to the ears, the study says, it's the stress it causes.

Noise is a problem for our health and especially for our spiritual health.

Mother Teresa said, "We need to find God, and he cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence. See how nature — trees, flowers, grass — grows in silence; see the stars, the moon and the sun, how they move in silence. We need silence to be able to touch souls."

It is so important for us to find those places and moments of silence. Cherish them. Soak them in whenever they happen. Make them happen! Pray during them, taking time to simply sit with God in the silence.

So often we look for loud messages from God. But in the sound of silence, God reveals his salvation for us.

- **Saturday evening. December 1, from 4-6 pm**




