It's 2019. Lots of us resolve to live differently with a new year. Sometimes, we succeed. Other times, not so much.

Thinking of resolutions, I was reminded of an answer I gave once when asked: *If you could change anything in your life, what would it be, and why?*

I answered something like this:

*There are things in my life, times when I have hurt other people, or made a bad decision, when I wish I would have done something*

*differently. You know, 'If I only knew then what I know now.' Except the only reason I do 'know now' is because I made that poor choice—because my actions or words did hurt someone. Those poor decisions, those less-than-honorable actions, however, have shaped me into the person I am now. I try to remember those things, and strive not to repeat them.*

Our mistakes are not intended to overwhelm us. What matters is how we live **today**. Don't worry about yesterday, or keep obsessing about tomorrow. Our primary daily concern is **today**.

So live **today**, remembering that God loves you and forgives you, no matter what you've done. Live to serve Christ **today**, and may you have a blessed new year. God's peace to you.

It was so nice of Pastor Jack, Pastor Liz, and Pastor Brock to come to see me and give me communion. Thank you for that.

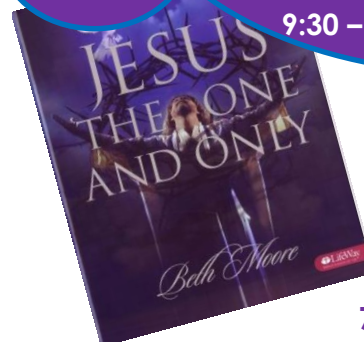
Also thank you for the flowers and the prayer shawl that the ladies gave me. It helps to keep me warm. Thank you also to all my friends for praying for me.

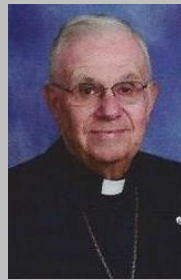
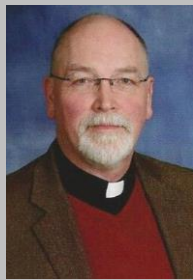
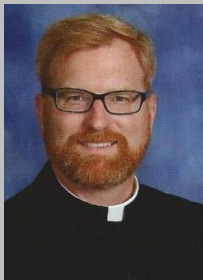
