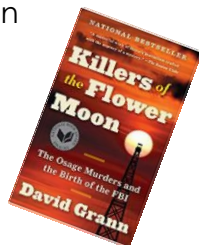

Faith Connect Kids! “40 Days of Kindness”

Many think of Lent as a time to give things up—to make sacrifices—as Jesus did for us. But Lent can also be a time to take things on—to make deliberate choices to live your life like Christ has called you to do—to serve all people, following the example of Jesus. This Lenten season our Faith Connect Kids! will take on

the task of serving others through “40 Days Kindness!” We’ll share God’s love with friends and family both in the church and in the community.

Week 1 – March 10th “Jesus Washes the Disciples’ Feet”

This week we will kick off our “40 Days of Kindness” with the story of Jesus washing the feet of the Disciples (John 13:1-17). Let’s be honest, many of our children are “served” regularly - meals are prepared and then magically cleaned up! Dirty clothes are washed, dried, and put neatly back in their drawers! Every night their toys march straight back into place! It is easy for them to think that they “deserve” to be served by the adults in their lives.

In this story, Jesus served his disciples, even though it seemed as if they should be serving him. Our kids will learn that they should serve others in the same way – they should lend a hand, instead of thinking they are too important to help. As Jesus teaches “anyone who wants to be first, must be the very last, and the servant of all.” (Mark 9:35)

Our kids will be making “service coupons” that they can hand out to family and friends. Perhaps they will take a turn at cleaning the dishes or folding the laundry? Maybe they will even pick up their toys at night!
