I (Noon)

[Stand]

The Invocation

Psalm 51 (read responsively)

P: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

C: Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.

P: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.

C: Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment.

P: Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me.

C: You desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart.

P: Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

C: Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have crushed rejoice.

P: Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.

C: Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.

P: Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me.

C: Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.

P: Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.

C: Deliver me from bloodshed, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance.

P: O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise.

C: For you have no delight in sacrifice; if I were to give a burnt offering, you would not be pleased.

P: The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

C: Do good to Zion in your good pleasure; rebuild the walls of Jerusalem,

P: then you will delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on your altar.

11 (12:25 p.m.)

Psalms 25 (read responsively)

P: To you, O LORD, I lift up my soul.

C: O my God, in you I trust; do not let me be put to shame; do not let my enemies exult over me.

P: Do not let those who wait for you be put to shame; let them be ashamed who are wantonly treacherous.

C: Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths.

P: Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long.

C: Be mindful of your mercy, O LORD, and of your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.

P: Do not remember the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for your goodness' sake, O LORD!

C: Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way.

P: He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way.

C: All the paths of the LORD are steadfast love and faithfulness, for those who keep his covenant and his decrees.

P: For your name's sake, O LORD, pardon my guilt, for it is great.

C: Who are they that fear the LORD? He will teach them the way that they should choose.

P: They will abide in prosperity, and their children shall possess the land.

C: The friendship of the LORD is for those who fear him, and he makes his covenant known to them.

P: My eyes are ever toward the LORD, for he will pluck my feet out of the net.

C: Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted.

P: Relieve the troubles of my heart, and bring me out of my distress.

C: Consider my affliction and my trouble, and forgive all my sins.

P: Consider how many are my foes, and with what violent hatred they hate me.

C: O guard my life, and deliver me; do not let me be put to shame, for I take refuge in you.

P: May integrity and uprightness preserve me, for I wait for you.

C: Redeem Israel, O God, out of all its troubles.

The Prayers

Time for Reflection

III (12:50 p.m.)

[Stand]

Psalm 69 (read responsively)

P: Save me, O God, for the waters have come up to my neck.

C: I sink in deep mire, where there is no foothold; I have come into deep waters, and the flood sweeps over me.

P: I am weary with my crying; my throat is parched. My eyes grow dim with waiting for my God.

C: More in number than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without cause; many are those who would destroy me, my enemies who accuse me falsely. What I did not steal must I now restore?

P: O God, you know my folly; the wrongs I have done are not hidden from you.

C: Do not let those who hope in you be put to shame because of me, O Lord GOD of hosts; do not let those who seek you be dishonored because of me, O God of Israel.

P: It is for your sake that I have borne reproach, that shame has covered my face.

C: I have become a stranger to my kindred, an alien to my mother's children.

P: It is zeal for your house that has consumed me; the insults of those who insult you have fallen on me.

C: When I humbled my soul with fasting, they insulted me for doing so.

P: When I made sackcloth my clothing, I became a byword to them.

C: I am the subject of gossip for those who sit in the gate, and the drunkards make songs about me.

P: But as for me, my prayer is to you, O LORD. At an acceptable time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love, answer me. With your faithful help

C: rescue me from sinking in the mire; let me be delivered from my enemies and from the deep waters.

P: Do not let the flood sweep over me, or the deep swallow me up, or the Pit close its mouth over me.

C: Answer me, O LORD, for your steadfast love is good; according to your abundant mercy, turn to me.

P: Do not hide your face from your servant, for I am in distress--make haste to answer me.

C: Draw near to me, redeem me, set me free because of my enemies.

P: You know the insults I receive, and my shame and dishonor; my foes are all known to you.

C: Insults have broken my heart, so that I am in despair. I looked for pity, but there was none; and for comforters, but I found none.

P: They gave me poison for food, and for my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink.

C: Let their table be a trap for them, a snare for their allies.

P: Let their eyes be darkened so that they cannot see, and make their loins tremble continually.

C: Pour out your indignation upon them, and let your burning anger overtake them.

P: May their camp be a desolation; let no one live in their tents.

C: For they persecute those whom you have struck down, and those whom you have wounded, they attack still more.

P: Add guilt to their guilt; may they have no acquittal from you.

C: Let them be blotted out of the book of the living; let them not be enrolled among the righteous.

P: But I am lowly and in pain; let your salvation, O God, protect me.

C: I will praise the name of God with a song; I will magnify him with thanksgiving.

P: This will please the LORD more than an ox or a bull with horns and hoofs.

C: Let the oppressed see it and be glad; you who seek God, let your hearts revive.

P: For the LORD hears the needy, and does not despise his own that are in bonds.

C: Let heaven and earth praise him, the seas and everything that moves in them.

P: For God will save Zion and rebuild the cities of Judah; and his servants shall live there and possess it;

C: the children of his servants shall inherit it, and those who love his name shall live in it.

IV (1:15 p.m.)

[Stand]

Psalms 22 (read responsively)

P: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?

C: O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.

P: Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.

C: In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.

P: To you they cried, and were saved; in you they trusted, and were not put to shame.

C: But I am a worm, and not human; scorned by others, and despised by the people.

P: All who see me mock at me; they make mouths at me, they shake their heads;

C: “Commit your cause to the LORD; let him deliver—let him rescue the one in whom he delights!”

P: Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother’s breast.

C: On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me you have been my God.

P: Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help.

C: Many bulls encircle me, strong bulls of Bashan surround me;

P: they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.

C: I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast;

P: my mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.

C: For dogs are all around me; a company of evildoers encircles me. My hands and feet have shriveled;

P: I can count all my bones. They stare and gloat over me;

C: they divide my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots.

P: But you, O LORD, do not be far away! O my help, come quickly to my aid!

C: Deliver my soul from the sword, my life from the power of the dog!

P: Save me from the mouth of the lion! From the horns of the wild oxen you have rescued me.

C: I will tell of your name to my brothers and sisters; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you:

P: You who fear the LORD, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him; stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel!

C: For he did not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted; he did not hide his face from me, but heard when I cried to him.

P: From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear him.

C: The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the LORD. May your hearts live forever!

P: All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD; and all the families of the nations shall worship before him.

C: For dominion belongs to the LORD, and he rules over the nations.

P: To him, indeed, shall all who sleep in the earth bow down; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, and I shall live for him.

C: Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord,

P: and proclaim his deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that he has done it.

V (1:40 p.m.)

[Stand]

Psalms 143 (read responsively)

P: Hear my prayer, O LORD; give ear to my supplications in your faithfulness; answer me in your righteousness.

C: Do not enter into judgment with your servant, for no one living is righteous before you.

P: For the enemy has pursued me, crushing my life to the ground, making me sit in darkness like those long dead.

C: Therefore my spirit faints within me; my heart within me is appalled.

P: I remember the days of old, I think about all your deeds, I meditate on the works of your hands.

C: I stretch out my hands to you; my soul thirsts for you like a parched land.

P: Answer me quickly, O LORD; my spirit fails. Do not hide your face from me, or I shall be like those who go down to the Pit.

C: Let me hear of your steadfast love in the morning, for in you I put my trust. Teach me the way I should go, for to you I lift up my soul.

P: Save me, O LORD, from my enemies; I have fled to you for refuge.

C: Teach me to do your will, for you are my God. Let your good spirit lead me on a level path.

P: For your name's sake, O LORD, preserve my life. In your righteousness bring me out of trouble.

C: In your steadfast love cut off my enemies, and destroy all my adversaries, for I am your servant.

Time for Reflection

VI (2:05 p.m.)

[Stand]

Psalm 31 (read responsively)

P: In you, O LORD, I seek refuge; do not let me ever be put to shame; in your righteousness deliver me.

C: Incline your ear to me; rescue me speedily. Be a rock of refuge for me, a strong fortress to save me.

P: You are indeed my rock and my fortress; for your name's sake lead me and guide me,

C: take me out of the net that is hidden for me, for you are my refuge.

P: Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O LORD, faithful God.

C: You hate those who pay regard to worthless idols, but I trust in the LORD.

P: I will exult and rejoice in your steadfast love, because you have seen my affliction; you have taken heed of my adversities,

C: and have not delivered me into the hand of the enemy; you have set my feet in a broad place.

P: Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress; my eye wastes away from grief, my soul and body also.

C: For my life is spent with sorrow, and my years with sighing; my strength fails because of my misery, and my bones waste away.

P: I am the scorn of all my adversaries, a horror to my neighbors, an object of dread to my acquaintances; those who see me in the street flee from me.

C: I have passed out of mind like one who is dead; I have become like a broken vessel.

P: For I hear the whispering of many-- terror all around!-- as they scheme together against me, as they plot to take my life.

C: But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, "You are my God."

P: My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies and persecutors.

C: Let your face shine upon your servant; save me in your steadfast love.

P: Do not let me be put to shame, O LORD, for I call on you; let the wicked be put to shame; let them go dumbfounded to Sheol.

C: Let the lying lips be stilled that speak insolently against the righteous with pride and contempt.

P: O how abundant is your goodness that you have laid up for those who fear you, and accomplished for those who take refuge in you, in the sight of everyone!

C: In the shelter of your presence you hide them from human plots; you hold them safe under your shelter from contentious tongues.

P: Blessed be the LORD, for he has wondrously shown his steadfast love to me when I was beset as a city under siege.

C: I had said in my alarm, "I am driven far from your sight." But you heard my supplications when I cried out to you for help.

P: Love the LORD, all you his saints. The LORD preserves the faithful, but abundantly repays the one who acts haughtily.

C: Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the LORD.

VII (2:30 p.m.)

[Stand]

Psalms 102 (read responsively)

P: Hear my prayer, O LORD; let my cry come to you.

C: Do not hide your face from me in the day of my distress. Incline your ear to me; answer me speedily in the day when I call.

P: For my days pass away like smoke, and my bones burn like a furnace.

C: My heart is stricken and withered like grass; I am too wasted to eat my bread.

P: Because of my loud groaning my bones cling to my skin.

C: I am like an owl of the wilderness, like a little owl of the waste places.

P: I lie awake; I am like a lonely bird on the housetop.

C: All day long my enemies taunt me; those who deride me use my name for a curse.

P: For I eat ashes like bread, and mingle tears with my drink, because of your indignation and anger; for you have lifted me up and thrown me aside.

C: My days are like an evening shadow; I wither away like grass.

P: But you, O LORD, are enthroned forever; your name endures to all generations.

C: You will rise up and have compassion on Zion, for it is time to favor it; the appointed time has come.

P: For your servants hold its stones dear, and have pity on its dust.

C: The nations will fear the name of the LORD, and all the kings of the earth your glory.

P: For the LORD will build up Zion; he will appear in his glory.

C: He will regard the prayer of the destitute, and will not despise their prayer.

P: Let this be recorded for a generation to come, so that a people yet unborn may praise the LORD:

C: that he looked down from his holy height, from heaven the LORD looked at the earth, to hear the groans of the prisoners, to set free those who were doomed to die;

P: so that the name of the LORD may be declared in Zion, and his praise in Jerusalem, when peoples gather together, and kingdoms, to worship the LORD.

C: He has broken my strength in midcourse; he has shortened my days.

P: "O my God," I say, "do not take me away at the mid-point of my life, you whose years endure throughout all generations."

C: Long ago you laid the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands.

P: They will perish, but you endure; they will all wear out like a garment. You change them like clothing, and they pass away; but you are the same, and your years have no end.

C: The children of your servants shall live secure; their offspring shall be established in your presence.
