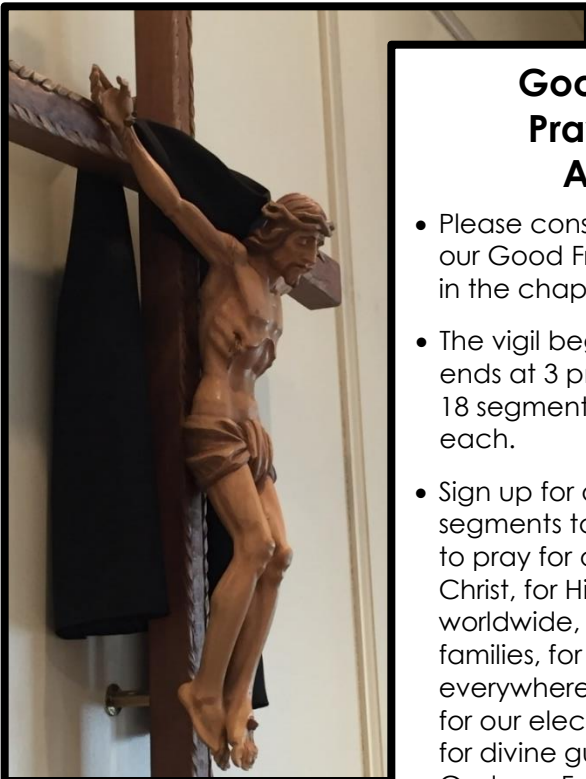

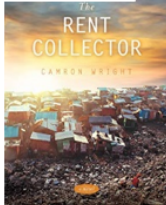

### Week 5 – April 7 – “God’s Love Sticks”

Life isn't always fair. When bad things happen or when things don't go as planned, we can be left feeling scared, upset, and angry. Maybe we didn't get the job we wanted, or an expensive appliance broke down, or someone betrayed our trust. Maybe it was something even bigger—an illness, a death—and we feel hopeless and ask why God hasn't stepped in to make it all good.

For kids, maybe you didn't get a part in the school play or on the sports team. Maybe you lost a big game, did badly on a test, or your friends were especially cruel. Life is not fair.

This week our kids will hear the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead (John 11:1-45). They'll learn that, even in the darkest of times, God is still in control—strong, powerful, and filled with love for us. Even when we can't make sense of life, we can trust in God to guide us through.

In class, our kids will decorate stickers. Throughout the week, they can share the stickers with people who may need a reminder that God is always with them, no matter how bad a situation may seem.
