We begin our worship service this weekend (Palm/Passion Sunday) by waving palms and singing joyously to remember Jesus' triumphant entry to Jerusalem. Next week, on Easter Sunday, we swell with even greater joy as we remember and celebrate the risen Christ.

But what of the period in between? How do we remember? During Holy Week—through responsive readings, prayer, confession, communion, and drama—Trinity offers daily services to experience that period between Palm Sunday and Easter, to contemplate it, and thus to understand it better. When they saw his arrest and crucifixion, they lost hope completely and things got very dark. Yet this was all part of God's plan!

When things look dark or scary and it's hard to have hope, remember that God also has a plan for YOU! The promises that God makes are always kept, including God's promise that Jesus' story would not end on the cross. Jesus reigns as our king in heaven, and his death saves us from our sins.

This week our kids will make paper flowers and deliver them to a friend or neighbor, along with an invitation to join us for Easter Sunday, where they will hear the good news that Jesus is risen. He is risen indeed!
