

Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. ²Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. ³When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; ⁴but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. ⁵As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. ⁶But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' ⁷Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. ⁸The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' ⁹But the wise replied, 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' ¹⁰And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. ¹¹Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' ¹²But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' ¹³Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

Preface

P: God of time and eternity, you set out the glory of your heavens and show us reflections of that glory in the details of life. When we find a thousand ways to corrupt and turn away from your grace, you transform our rejection into your providence. You dwelled among your people in the cloud and pillar of fire, in the tabernacle and temple; and finally, you dwelled among us in your Son Jesus. In his death you defeat death, and in his resurrection, you offer us life with you forever, where we shall dwell with you, with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven, singing the hymn of your unending praise:

Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy)

C: **Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

Eucharistic Prayer

P: God of deliverance, in the cross of Jesus we see what it costs you to dwell among us, and in this bread and wine we see your costly love among us today. Send down your Holy Spirit, that your people may be blessed by your grace, and these gifts of bread and wine may be for us the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ;

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

P: Great is the mystery of faith.

C: **Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.**

P: God of everlasting faithfulness, you have promised that you will draw us together with you. Give us hope until the day comes when the new Jerusalem descends and all creation meets its fulfillment in the union of heaven and earth, where every tear is dried and all the oppressed are vindicated, all prisons are opened, and the fear of death is no more, and we see you face to face and dwell in your presence, ever one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

Sharing our Lord's Supper

All Christians are welcome to celebrate the real presence of Jesus Christ in our Lord's Supper. At the direction of the pastor, receive the bread at the end of your row, and then exit the worship space by the center aisle through the rear glass doors. Communion distribution will begin with the back rows.

At this time, we will be offering only the wafer of bread and no wine. Be assured that you still receive the entire presence of God in that single element, as our Lutheran theology teaches us. If you need a gluten-free wafer, simply ask the pastor as you approach. Non-communing children and adults are invited to come forward for a blessing.
