## Nicene Creed

P: Let us profess our common faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.

C: **We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the + resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

### Proper Preface

P: Steadfast God, you alone are worthy of praise and thanksgiving. You created all there is and welcomed us to share in every detail with you; your persevering hold on all you have created never relents. Through Rachel and Joseph you shaped your people to be a blessing to the nations, in times of joy but also in sorrow and suffering. When the torment of slavery seemed unbreakable, your imagination unlocked unyielding shackles. When exile seemed endless, your mercies never failed. And when your Son came to be born in the midst of all you created, you did not spare him human sorrow and suffering, even the cross. He knew exile while still an infant. As he and his parents escaped to safety when so many other children went to death, years later in Jerusalem he went to death that all your children might live with you in resurrection glory. And so we give you thanks, praising you with angels and archangels, as we join their unending hymn:

## Eucharistic Prayer

*Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.*

P: God of all consolation, pierce the heart of your church with the same cries that pierce your heart. Where suppressed years of history have left blood crying from the ground, make us people who seek the truth. Where the innocent die as bystanders, make us people who remember. Where families fleeing for safety seek refuge in unfamiliar lands, make us people of welcome. Where parents weep over the death of a child, make us people of tenacious love. Meet our tears with your holy comfort and turn our sorrow into wisdom for others to share, until that day when we gather round the throne of the Lamb in endless praise to you, living God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
